AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HANNIBAL REVISING CHAPTER 17, ARTICLE II –ADMINSTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT, OF THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF HANNIBAL BY REVOKING DIVISION 2 – COMMITTEE FOR MANAGEMENT OF TRAFFIC PROBLEMS AND ENACTING A NEW DIVISION 2 IN ITS PLACE

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that changes in staff positions and processes followed by the committee make changes in Division 2 necessary and appropriate, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that such changes are in the best interests of the Citizens of Hannibal to ensure the legal and smooth operation of the traffic committee.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HANNIBAL:

SECTION ONE: The City Council hereby revokes CHAPTER 17, ARTICLE II., DIVISION 2 – COMMITTEE FOR MANAGEMENT OF TRAFFIC PROBLEMS, and enacts in its place the following new CHAPTER 17, ARTICLE II., DIVISION 2 –in the ordinances of the City of Hannibal.

SECTION TWO:

DIVISION 2. - COMMITTEE FOR MANAGEMENT OF TRAFFIC PROBLEMS

Sec. 17-58. - Establishment.

There is hereby established the committee for the management of traffic problems.

Sec. 17-59. - Membership.

The committee for the management of traffic problems shall consist of the city manager or their designee, the chief of police or their designee, the director of central services or their designee, the fire chief or their designee.

Sec. 17-60. - Duties.

The committee for the management of traffic problems shall investigate traffic matters coming before the city council. In addition, the committee shall:

- (1) Recommend specific courses of action to the council following investigations of complaints, petitions or requests regarding traffic matters.
- (2) Seek the assistance of the state highway department and such private engineers as may be necessary in the solution of traffic problems. The council shall authorize necessary funds for reimbursement of private consultants as may be required.
- (3) Make a periodic review of the data on accidents, vehicle volumes, and the traffic control devices in place on the street system, and take steps to correct any deficiencies which they observe in the manner in which such are maintained.
- (4) Study all traffic control devices in the city and take such action as is necessary to ensure conformance with accepted standards.
- (5) Make a study, where warranted, of intersections with the purpose of improving sight distance through the removal or control of sight.

Sec. 17-61. - Use of city employees for traffic studies.

Members of the committee for the management of traffic problems may make use of its respective staffs as necessary to collect and analyze data for any studies they may make.

Sec. 17-62. - Budget requests.

The committee for the management of traffic problems shall submit budget requests for funds necessary for the operation of the committee and its program in accordance with the procedure used by heads of departments of the city.

Secs. 17-63—17-69. - Reserved.

SECTION THREE: It hereby is declared to be the intention of the City Council that each and every part, portion and sub-portion of this Ordinance shall be separate and severable from each and every other part, portion or sub-portion hereof and that the City Council intends to adopt each said part, portion or sub-portion separately and independently of any other part, portion or sub-portion. In the event that any part of this Ordinance shall be determined to be or to have been unlawful or unconstitutional, the remaining parts, portions and sub-portions shall be and remain in full force and effect.

SECTION FOUR: All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance, in so far as they conflict, are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
